	Location:	<p>Open house directional signs may be placed on the public road allowance excluding any centre median, traffic island or centre boulevard within the road allowance</p> <p>Shall not be located closer than 0.3 metre from the pedestrian sidewalk and from the vehicular travelled portion of the road</p> <p>Shall not be affixed to a utility pole, tree, official sign (such as, parking signs) or other public property</p>	<p>Real estate signs permitted by this article to be located on public property shall be positioned so as to prevent damage to underground services</p> <p>No real estate sign shall be erected or maintained at any location where it may interfere with, obstruct the view of, or be confused with an authorized traffic sign, signal or warning device</p> <p>No real estate sign shall be erected or maintained that may obstruct the view of any pedestrian or driver of a motor vehicle or may interfere with vehicular movement to such a degree as may endanger any person or risk damage to any vehicle</p>
